Fatal Outcome after Injection of Topical Epinephrine

The Institute for Safe Medication Practices Canada (ISMP Canada) has issued a call to action to enhance the safety of epinephrine intended for topical use and to prevent incidents involving the inadvertent injection of this product.

Information in the Safety Bulletin describes a case of inadvertent injection of epinephrine and presents a number of recommendations. ISMP Canada urges healthcare practitioners to review these recommendations with their pharmacy and operating room teams and to take the necessary steps to prevent a recurrence.

Journal of Otolaryngology – Head & Neck Surgery

The past year has been an exciting one at the Journal of Otolaryngology-Head & Neck Surgery. We are very pleased to announce that Thomson Reuters has reported our 2008 Impact Factor at .758, which is a significant increase from .497 in 2007 and .368 in 2006. The Journal ranks at 25 out of 31 journals in our category up from 27 out of 30 in 2007 and 29 out of 30 in 2006. For a journal of our size and readership, this represents a significant gain for which we are most proud.

While we have received 433 submissions from 33 different countries, our acceptance rate has been 37.8%, with submissions primarily from Canada, Turkey, and the United States. Our Associate Editorship, announced in January, has also undergone some changes. Our special thanks to Brian Blakley, Rob Hart, Jonathon Irish, Emad Massoud, Paul Moxham, and Ian Witterick for their diligent efforts that have helped us to achieve our goals this year.

This past year the Editors-in-Chief and Managing Editor conducted a workshop at the CSO meeting in Halifax on the topic of de-mystifying the manuscript submission and review process. Slides will be available on the CSO website. Watch for another exciting session at the Niagara Falls Meeting which will focus on the peer review process as well as understanding and enhancing the reviewer's role in this process.

Becoming a reviewer is an excellent way to contribute to the field while keeping abreast of cutting edge developments as they arise. 
